Loon Park (Pocket park next to Ely's Ivy)

Repaired/renovated the supporting base of loon art sculpture

Pillsbury Park – Temporary Sculpture Garden

(Undeveloped land next to Urban Stampede)

- Design Team: PAC, Public Works, DDA, and Community Dev.
- Contracted artist Adam Kemp for consulting services for park
- Commissioned local artist MJ Haji-Sheikh to create sculpture

Northern Rose Public Art Sculpture

ADA accessible sidewalks and seating

Arbor Park / University Park

- Transferred City's arbor tree art sculpture to University Park
- Structural support, sculpture bases, and landscaping installed
- MOU established & sculpture added to PAC's insurance

Infrastructure, Maintenance & Signage 2024/2025 GOALS

Pillsbury Park – Temporary Sculpture Garden

- Continue to develop park with committee
- Install art sculptures
- Add park signage
 - Communicate the purpose and temporary status
 - Braille signage ND Council on the Arts Grant

Cleaning / Repair of City-Owned Public Art Structures

- Approve list of identified artwork with City
- Contract local artist to clean/repair
